The full payment acknowledged here does not include the interment fee for burial service or the cost for memorialization at the burial space.

This document provides a receipt of full payment allowing burials and memorialization at the burial space. Plus it states tersely that this is not a real estate transaction, but a purchase of burial rights within a cemetery continuously owned and operated by the parish.
