In addition, our Family Service Counselors participate in continuing education programs to better understand grief and trauma.

Follow-Up Grief Support

After someone has died, you find the void real, the loss heartbreaking. Just keeping busy or letting time pass is not enough. You move through weeks, months, even years often feeling alone, tired and scared. There are times of falling back...times of gaining ground. And, the journey is uniquely yours, but help is there.
